# SUPPLIER PROFILE - B & W LOWE CONTRACTING

For the last 10 years William and Bill Lowe have been providing our mowing service. They do a great job and we find them extremely easy to work in with daily, both with the balers and choppers.

Bill is now retired, with William running the business day to day. William and his wife Jane have three children and live on their mixed cropping/grazing farm at Valetta. William takes great pride in the quality of their mowing work, which is a huge positive for JHC.

Lowes operate 4 sets of Kuhn triple mowers conditioners on a mix of JCB and John Deere tractors. The benefits of conditioning mowers is quite apparent when producing silage. Conditioned grass wilts much faster, as opposed to a conventional bar mower. We often bale or chop a crop a day earlier if it has been conditioned. Less drying time means more energy is retained in the plant and ultimately better resultant feed quality.



# CULTIVATION - KÖCKERLING REBELL DISC ROLLER

This season sees the addition of a new Köckerling 6m Disc-Roller cultivator to our fleet. After researching and demoing several other machines, Cultivation manager David Stafford favoured the Köckerling as it provides a cost-effective cultivation pass across several situations from discing up ex-winter feed paddocks and old pasture blocks to preparing a fine, level seedbed in ploughed ground.

This machine comprises of three main elements:

1. 50 scalloped discs at 13cm spacing's that can work from a depth of 2cm down to 12cm.
2. Hydraulically adjustable levelling paddles to create and carry a wave of soil to fill in any hollow areas of a paddock and removing any ridging effects.
3. Double interlocking steel packer to consolidate and crush clods to an even size creating a well-structured seedbed.

In addition to these elements the machine is fitted with full hydraulic depth control, allowing our operators to adapt to changing conditions in the paddock. The machine features a rear drawbar which allows us to tow a roller equipped with levelling paddles behind the cultivator. This leaves seedbeds level and consolidated, ready to be drilled.

It has already proved a valuable tool in working up paddocks coming out of winter feed crops and will be an excellent option going forward in seedbed preparation. It will complement our plough with integrated press particularly well; as it will provide the opportunity to cultivate and level paddocks (when used in conjunction with the roller) in a single pass as opposed to ploughing, cultivating then levelling and rolling the paddock. This will reduce the cost per hectare to establish a crop for the grower without compromising on the finished quality of the paddock.

Some of the overseas lads took advantage of a wet November weekend, heading down to the Speights Brewery in Dunedin. And yes they did actually come back.





# CUSTOMER PROFILE - BLACK HILL STATION DUNCAN AND FEE ENSOR

Duncan and Fee Ensor own and operate Black Hill Station on Double Hill Run Road in the Rakaia Gorge. Black Hill was originally part of Glenrock Station.

Predominantly breeding and finishing Sheep, the farm is a total of 2700 ha. 2100 hectares of flat/rolling land at river level and 600ha of flat land on a plateau further up the Blackhill Range at an altitude of 900m, which Duncan has developed in recent years.

The farm is planted in various areas of Grass, Lucerne, Chicory, Red Clover and Triticale. JHC round bale crops such as Lucerne for balage, which are often fed as supplement from July to September.

Duncan recently planted a large area of "Raphno" which is a hybrid of Kale and Radish. Raphno can be grazed multiple times (up to 4-5 times over a 12-month period), shows good yield results, drought/clubroot/aphid tolerance and offers flexibility with grazing.

In recent times Duncan has found the addition of a Drone to be of great use for stock work, particularly with animals on terrain that can be time consuming to access.



Duncan also owns NZ Fencing Solutions, a company he set up which sells all types of fencing products to farmers and fencing contractors. The products are 80% sourced from New Zealand manufacturers, 20% imported from Asia. He set up the company on the back of his own experience developing Black Hill Station. His biggest clients are in Central Otago and Southland.

Fee is a real estate agent for Bayley's mid-Canterbury. Having taken up the role in 2018, she has had great success so far and in March this year was awarded Bayley's Rookie of the Year. She has mainly focussed on Lifestyle Blocks and Residential houses to date.

Duncan and Fee have three children: Samantha (20), who works on the farm with Duncan, Charlie (18) who is in the Army and Jenna (16), who is at Mt Hutt College.

Out of work the family enjoy horse riding and hunting. Duncan is a member of the local volunteer fire brigade and Fee is a Methven St Johns volunteer.

For the last 18 years we have taken on experienced staff from Australia, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, France, Germany, Switzerland, Czech Republic, Sweden, Denmark, Bulgaria, Canada, USA, South Africa, India, Philippines, plus many others. This year it looks very unlikely our NZ borders will be open to workers from other countries. Hence our team will predominantly be from within NZ. We are fortunate to have the advantage that more than 50% of our operators are in fulltime roles. This core of experience is invaluable when training incoming seasonal operators. The recruitment process has been much longer than usual, but we are quite pleased with the people we have joining our team for the 2020/21 season.

To ensure we maintain (and improve) our quality, efficiency, and safety standards we have focussed on training systems improvements and our management team. Tom Martin (who has been part of our senior team for a long time), has shifted permanently into a combined operator training and service technician role. Tom has operated all of our various machines over the years and is a great resource for our operators. Tom will be training and assessing each of them to make sure they get all the guidance they need. As per usual the rest of our senior team will also be involved in training any new operators.


